2010 CONSTRUCTION / WORKPLAN UPDATES

This is a broad overview of the activities that are planned for the year 2010. To date some of the projects have been completed, some are underway and others are should begin before year's end.

2010 Activities will include:

North Valley

- Complete soil stripping and reclamation activities north of Warm Springs Creek near the Galen Highway
- Initiate and complete cleanup of Airport property
- Initiate cleanup of property at the corner of Galen and Lost Creek Highways
- Reclamation activities will be completed in the West Galen Area #2
- The State of Montana will initiate reclamation activities on Stucky Ridge

West Valley

- Complete West Valley Rail Line removal
- Crossings excavated and backfilled

Railroad Cleanup

- Complete cleanup of In-Town Main Rail Line
- Initiate cleanup of West Rail Yards
- Complete removal activities on properties adjacent to the Main Rail Line
- Initiate removal of the railroad embankment at the Blue Lagoon

Old Works

- Complete removals within Blocks 1 and 4 of the Industrial Park
- Place final covers on Block 3 of the Industrial Park
- Complete stormwater controls at the Arbiter Plant
- Initiate and complete cleanup of Sewage Treatment Parcel

Anaconda Ponds

- Storm water ditch along Mill Creek Highway
- Planting 1.5 million plants in the new wetland area adjacent to The Ponds
- Continue re-vegetation activities on The Ponds

2010 Document modifications and Fourth Five – Year Review:

Along with the remediation / construction activities there are important documents being amended as well as the Fourth Five – Year Review taking place.

Documents

- Anaconda Regional Water, Waste & Soils (ARWW&S) Record of Decision (ROD) Amendment
- Community Soils Proposed Plan
- Community Soils ROD Amendment

Five – Year Review

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has es-

tablished that whenever remedial action on a Superfund site leaves hazardous materials on the site, or areas of the site, which do not permit people and animals to use the land without restrictions a review will be conducted every five years.

In 2010, the Fourth Five-Year Review of the Anaconda Smelter site will be taking place. This review is as way for EPA:

1) to monitor the site's current condition; 2) to see the progress being made on clean-up activities within the previous five years; 3) to make sure people and the environment continue to be safeguarded as the clean-up continues and 4) to listen to concerns and questions regarding the site, its clean-up and future use you may have.
